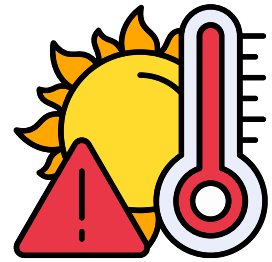

- **Next Week**

Heatwave: Children can wear PE kits next week for Creative Arts Week and this will also help with the heat. All year groups are out on at least one local trip next week for Creative Arts Week, so top up suncream in bags may be a good idea on those days.



Next week, the leadership team will be doing some collaborative work with Trust Leaders on behaviour.

Our children will be performing at the Epsom and Ewell Dance Festival on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and will be rehearsing at the Playhouse on Monday.

The excitement is also building in Year 3 as the children – and staff! – prepare for Thursday's sleepover. Year 3 parents, please remember that the **children will be dismissed at 1:15pm on Friday 26th June.**



Hampers for the Summer Fair: The Friends will be collecting hamper donations on Monday.

On Friday, our Year 6 children are participating in a STEM workshop. This is a fully funded workshop delivered by Royal Academy of Engineering STEM Ambassadors, one of whom happens to be a parent at our school. The workshop presents the children with a series of challenges that come from an illustrated storybook. The children will have to work with each other at some hands-on engineering challenges to solve real life problems. This is such an amazing opportunity for our pupils and I look forward to sharing more about it with you next week.

- **Creative Arts Week** is finally here, and we will be coming off timetable for a week of creative learning and new experiences.

Children may wear their PE kit for the whole week so that they are ready for every eventuality. A team of staff has worked on the event, which involves workshops from external providers such as Sound Lab, Lamda and Eduthing. Blenheim High School will be working with Year 4 and 5 on drama and music. Staff will be running workshops around the school, drawing on their own areas of expertise and these range from dance to textiles, and pottery to drumming. Classes will also be heading outside to visit Horton Arts Centre, Horton Country Park, Epsom Therapy Garden and the Hogsmill to inspire their own creative work in class. It is certainly going to be a special week and we hope that the children will come away with some great memories. All events and materials for the week have been funded by The Friends.

Creative Arts Week will finish the following week with a whole school parade, featuring samba rhythms and class-made props on **Monday 29th June at 2:30pm**. We would love for parents, families and friends to join us and support the children. Spectators are asked to stand on the grass area in **Long Grove Park**, opposite the school and be ready to cheer, wave and dance as we pass. The parade will begin at the main gate and finish near **Cherryfields Nursery** at approximately 3:00pm. We then ask that you collect your child from their usual exit at the designated time. We are hoping to create a wonderful community atmosphere, so please do invite family members and friends along to watch and celebrate the children's work.

Once the system is fully ready to launch, you will receive an email from SchoolGrid containing an activation link and full details of next steps that must be completed before school starts in September. ● Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

If families take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19th August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19th August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Requests for exceptional leave need to be submitted using the form on our website, at least 2 weeks before the date being requested. All other exceptional leave will or will not be authorised on a case by case basis. A child's attendance and previous requests for leave will always be considered when making a decision.

YEAR 4'S TRIP TO HORTON COUNTRY PARK



On Tuesday morning Year Four set off for Horton County Park with our teachers, extra staff and friends of the year group. As we walked and talked to each other, the forest grew around us. Vibrant, healthy plants swaying in the warm breeze. At the Horton County Park, we met the park rangers, Sarah, Stuart and Lindsay, who told us some rules about the behaviour in the park. Then, we split into four groups half 4K half 4J and in those groups we chose pairs or small groups to work together in. In my group, I was with Karina, Rouqi and Cian and we were in the long grass searching for minibeasts.

Since it was hard to see them in the long grass, we had to use a net to capture the insects in a way that they couldn't get out of the net – drag, lift, twist and bush beating. After finding the insects, we took a closer look at them with different microscopes. Then we did pond dipping and found some fascinating creatures. Next, we had lunch together and we all had an ice lolly! Later, we had a scavenger hunt in the woods where we looked for stinky leaves, textured leaves, and more. Soon after, we had a relaxing draw of nature, and we did some tree rubbings. Then, we walked back happily, warm after a lovely day! **Poppy-lfé, 4K**

In Horton Park, we first went to catch insects in the grass. The grass was so high it reached up to our waists. Gently, we used our nets swiftly to catch various types of bugs. When we went pond dipping, we put our boots on and squelched in the thick mud. Inside the murky, misty pond was a water scorpion snapping its hands anxiously, trying to dodge the massive nets. Further in the deep pond, there was a peaceful shady area. There was a city of trees looming over us like enormous buildings. Later, we did a scavenger hunt which was fun. We were finding lots of objects in the woods.



At the end, we did some calming sketching while sitting on the fluffy grass. **Karina, 4K**



This week we went on a school trip, and it was so much fun! We did pond dipping, insect finding, natural art and a scavenger hunt in the woods. First, we did insect finding and we found crickets, grasshoppers, shield bugs, and loads of other cool things. Then we did pond dipping and we found tiny bugs, newts, and even a water scorpion, which was amazing. After that, we made nature art by putting leaves under our paper and drawing on top, so the patterns showed through. Finally, we did a scavenger hunt in the woods with partners.

My partner and I didn't win, but we still had the best time ever. **Nate, 4K**

On the walk there, me and my friend couldn't wait. We met up with one of the Horton Country Park Rangers who directed us to the field where we would stay for the day. As soon as we got there, we got straight into sketching nature, and I went into the forest and sketched a really cool plant. Then we did a scavenger hunt where we had a sheet and we had to find things like a feather, something shiny, something smooth and something sticky. After that, we had lunch, but before we did we washed our hands! We played a lot of football, then we got into pairs and did some pond dipping.



Me and my partner found a rare water scorpion I thought was pretty cool. Then we did the woodland activity – trying to catch mini eels and I caught a really big cricket! Eventually, it was time to go, so we packed up and arrived back at school. **Harvey, 4J**



First, we walked from school to Horton Country Park and we sat down with our heavy backpacks. Then, we went off to a field to give 4J some more space. After, we went into the forest to do some detailed sketching and a scavenger hunt to see if we could find the objects. Soon, we all went back and 4K joined us for lunch. We all played together in the field. Some of us played football, some of us held races and some of us just sat chatting in the shade. Next, 4K went to the field and we went down to the pond.

We fished out bloodworms, water scorpions and more. After, we went to the long grass by the pond and caught bugs, like ladybird larvae. Then we left. It was a long way back but worth the trip! **Evie, 4J**

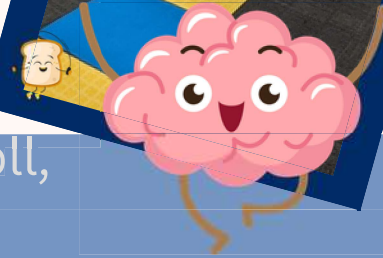

We hope you are able to join us.

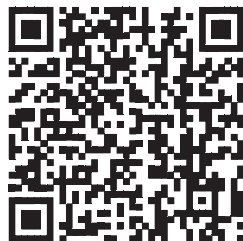

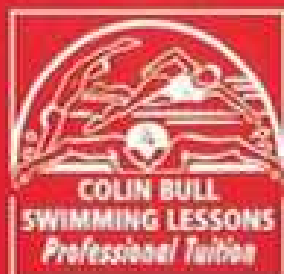
