Workhouse	A place in which the poorest people received food and lodgings in return for work.
Terrain	An area of land and its natural feature.
Census	An official count or survey of a population.
Empire	A group of countries ruled over by a single monarch.
Trade	The action of buying or selling goods or services.
Railway	A network of tracks using trains to connect towns.
Transport	Using a vehicle to travel from one place to another
Settlement	Settlements are places where people live and sometimes work
Industry	An industry is a group of businesses that make or sell similar products or perform similar services.
Tourist	a person who is travelling or visiting a place for pleasure
Immigrant	a person who comes to live permanently in a foreign country

Victorian Epsom:

Epsom saw a huge amount of change during the Victorian time. The current high street was mainly used for houses. There was also a lack of transport in the area.



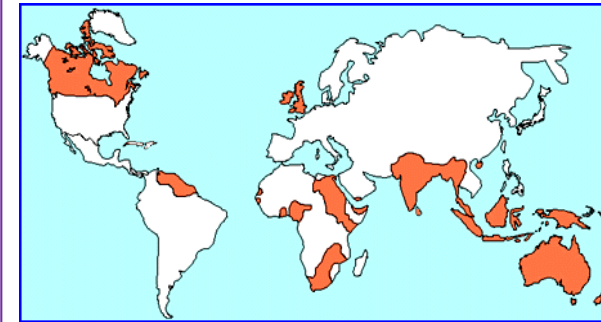
British Empire:

The British Empire began in the late 1500s under Queen Elizabeth I.

By 1913 the empire had grown to rule over 400 million people, making it the largest empire in history.

British government and society benefitted economically from the empire.

The people colonised by the British had British laws and customs imposed upon them, lost their ability to govern themselves and were, in many cases, violently oppressed.
