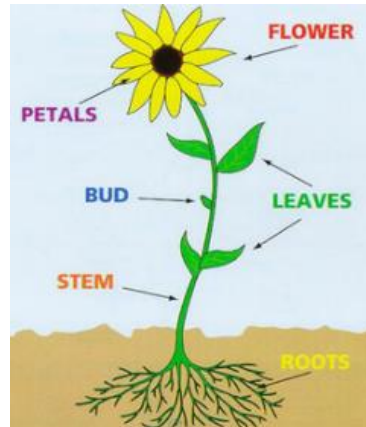

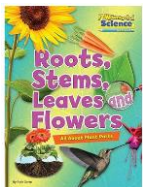
Key Vocabulary

Seed	The part of a flowering plant that can grow into a new plant.
Stem/Stalk	Part of a plant which helps support it and keep it upright.
Leaf	Part of a plant which absorbs sunlight which is used by the plant to make food.
Bud	A small growth that that develops into a leaf, flower, or shoot.
Flower	The bloom or blossom of a plant.
Petal	Petals are part of a flowering plant which attract insects such as bees.
Blossom	A flower that grows on certain trees and plants.
Root	Part of a plant which takes in water and nutrients from the soil.
Trunk	The stem of a tree.
Branch	A part of a tree which grows out from the trunk.
Bark	The outer layer of stems of woody plants.
Fruit	A part of a plant that contains seeds.
Berry	A small, fleshy fruits that usually have many seeds.
Light	A form of energy. E.g. the sun.
Shade	An area where there is no light from the sun.
Sun	A star at the centre of our solar system.
Cool	A fairly low temperature.
Warm	A temperature between cool and hot.
Grow	To become larger.
