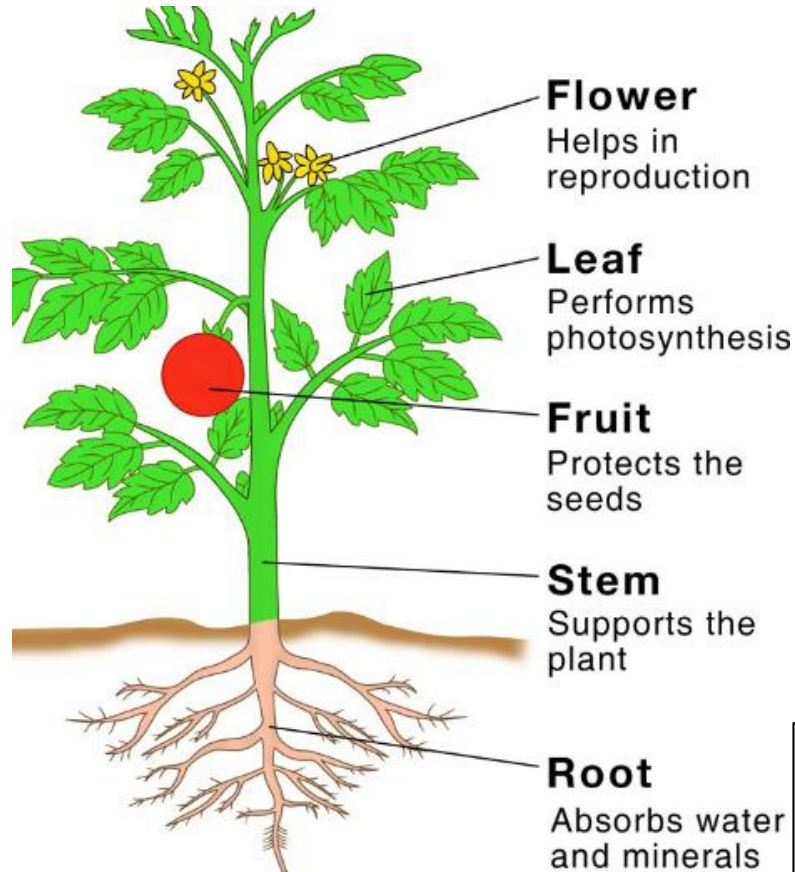


Plants

Key Vocabulary

Photosynthesis	The process in which plants use sunlight to make their own food
Pollen	Pollen is a fine powder produced by certain plants.
Insect pollination	Pollen is transferred from one flower to another by insects
Wind pollination	Pollen is transferred from one flower to another by the wind
Seeds	The small parts produced by plants from which new plants grow
Seed dispersal	The way seeds are carried or spread to other places

Explosion

How does water move through a plant?

1. Roots absorb water from the soil.
2. The water is sucked up through the stem (just like the way you suck up a drink through a straw!)
3. The stem passes water on to the leaves.
4. Water evaporates from the leaves.
