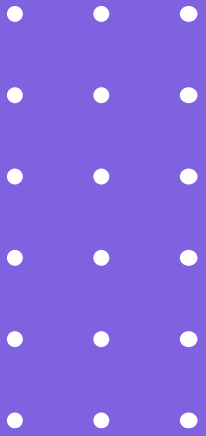

- RE - What is the Bible's 'big story' and why is it like treasure for Christians? & How did Jesus change lives and how is it 'good news'?
- Science - Rocks & Forces and magnets

- Please continue to read with your child as often as you are able and note this in the homework diary.
- If your child is continuing with the Little Wandle reading programme, they will bring home their reading book on a Friday (same as year 2) to read to you over the weekend and to be returned on Monday morning.
- If your child is no longer on the Little Wandle reading programme, your child will be able to take home a book from the class book corner to read at home and change when needed.
- There will be a weekly spelling homework with a list of words to practice which will come home on a Friday. These spellings link with our in class learning and will be tested in class the following Friday.
- There will be a weekly maths homework which comes home on a Friday and is an opportunity for your children to consolidate the learning that has taken place in class that week.
